2023 has been a very successful year for our photographic association! During this year, we in GPU worked hard with new activities, taking back whatever the COVID period had deprived us of! During 2023 we have sucesefully organized and executed the following events and activities:



The 3rd GPU Under 25 exhibition, which was exclusively for young photographers under 25 years of age. The event received a warm response from young artists, and it attracted a large number of participants. This exhibition was organized with the aim of inspiring young people to stay creative despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, and we are proud to say that our mission and vision was fulfilled.

The 3rd GPU Virtual Photo Festival, following the success of the Festivals in 2021 and 2022. We found that the initiative was well-received by members and many visitors accessed the online galleries, hopefully encouraging their creativity. In China, we had the privilege of co-organizing the prestigious Photo Beijing 2023 event, one of the largest photographic events in the world. As part of this event, we are presenting two photo exhibitions, one showcasing the works of our members, and the other featuring photographs from 10 presidents of Arabic countries. This event has helped us establish a long-term partnership with Photo Beijing.

Inauguration of the second GPU photographic center in Europe in Suceava, Romania, with parallel events, an exhibition with 50 photographs of GPU members, and a portrait workshop.

We licensed more than 250 photo salons all over the world, as well as a large number of photo titles, both of which outnumbered those of previous years. Introduction of a new title, Grand Master, which is the highest a GPU member can apply for, and we are thrilled to notice that some distinguished photographers have accomplished acquiring this challenging title.

The donation exhibition of photographs to an health institution in North Macedonia, the organization of exhibitions and workshops around the world, the publication of our established Magazine, and most importantly for GPU activity, the 6th Photo

Festival 2023 in Kyrgyzstan. More than 80 members have participated! The nine days of our pahoto festival were conducted with the ingredients of love and passion for photography. That's why GPU has always been selecting places of remarkable beauty. In addition, joining a GPU Photo Festival offers the opportunity to photograph the uniqueness of a landscape or a culture and the chance to create friendships or strengthen existing ones.


MISSION PLANET EARTH

I believe that my work represents a sort of mission, yes, that's right, I consider myself more of a missionary than a photographer. I'm writing this because I've been traveling the world for 33 years, combining an immense passion with a great profession. I certainly consider myself privileged because I have no doubts in thinking that being supported to travel around, discover and describe the world, its wonders, its diversity but also its fragilities, can simply be defined as the most beautiful job in the world. But treasuring every day what I discover, what I learn and keeping this immense treasure just for myself would certainly be an act of pure selfishness and here comes my missionary being, that is, through the evocative power of photography and the universal language of images, I manage to bring this small but immense world into everyone's homes through articles, interviews, conferences, books, exhibitions and documentaries, especially in the eyes of those who want to know it and in the hearts of those who know how to

appreciate it. And in the digital age this is also called sharing.

But behind such a beautiful activity there are always a thousand difficulties to face, the first is to make sense of what we have to do, that is, to create an idea, a project that can support a journey which will then be transformed into a reportage or a television documentary. Digital has helped the development of photography on many fronts but at the same time it has also killed a profession by putting everyone on the same level. Today it is not those who manage to take a nice shot with a "wow" and "tearlike" effect that get ahead, that photo will lead to nothing other than a mere, futile, personal satisfaction, what matters instead is to create a story, the more original and interesting, to be developed and to be able to tell it through images.

There are photographers who love nature photography and if you ask them to photograph a Laotian temple they cry scandal. There are photographers who dedicate their lives to capturing faces, but don't ask them to portray a landscape because they don't even know where to start. Even though I am already a grandfather, I am a bit like a curious child, curious about everything, about discovering the world, about documenting its immense landscapes, about capturing the stories of the last great ethnic groups, about stopping the gaze of a feline while you stare straight in the eye. This is what being a photographer really means to me. And then I never stopped at anything, in the 156 countries I visited I documented everything I could: from the geographical North Pole which I reached on foot to the Antarctica, passing through mountains, canyons, volcanoes, geysir, lakes, rivers , oceans, waterfalls, deserts, savannas, steppes, forests, tundra, taiga and glaciers. And every time it was a new challenge, personal, from a psycho-physical and technical point of view, therefore from a photographic point of view. Bringing a story home means having a series of images that you will only discover when you find yourself in front of them,



that's where the real challenge of the photographer begins, studying the light, the best shot, the composition, choosing the exact moment which often, making a mistake only second, it will never be the same again. And then, being among the very few who photographs the world on every level, therefore landscape, ethnographic and wildlife in all environments including the polar regions where I have been 50 times, the reasoning to develop on a shot is different each time. For example, photographing mountains is very difficult given how large they are and finding a strong point to capture in a shot is anything but trivial. But it is also difficult to capture the ephemeral and dancing light of the Northern Lights which you never know when it starts, how long it lasts and what intensity it has. Portraying a polar bear cub at 53 below zero is a double challenge: for your fingers and for your camera batteries. Descending to 20 meters in the Indian Ocean and photographing a group of sharks requires calm and concentration. Photographing the Milky Way in the Atacama Desert, next to the largest telescopic observatories in the world, gives you the certainty of not being able to miss the shot. Filming an iceberg breaking away from Jakobshavn, the largest Arctic glacier in Greenland, floods you with that sense of profound sadness but at the same time


you have to be very quick to seize the moment. And if flying in a hot air balloon over the expanse of the Australian outback gives you that sense of infinity, lowering yourself with a drone into the cavity of an active volcano in Vanuatu and Iceland and waiting for the moment of the explosion to catch the lapilli of incandescent lava that touch your video camera is pure adrenaline. To do this job you certainly need to have passion, perseverance, patience, determination and that pinch of recklessness. In more than 30 years of travel around the world I have twice escaped from elephant charges, once a polar bear chased me, another time I was left without oxygen at 20 meters while chasing five grey











sharks, yet another, in the jungle of Belize while we were looking for the jaguar, I was stung by an insect whose neurotoxic venom progressively took away the strength in my arms and legs. I went to bed crossing myself and praying to God. That time I was really afraid.

But today's photographer, if he wants to define himself as such, must grow and progress hand in hand with technology. So from the photo we will have to move on to the video which has a completely different narrative although the language is the same but to do so, alongside the usual camera used for photos, we will have to use action cams such as GoPro for different shooting fields and above all a flying cam, the drone. In this particular moment of my life the drone is everything. I could give up a breath of fresh air, but not my drone, one of my three drones. It's the dream I've been chasing for 30 years, when I flew over Angmassalik in eastern Greenland with a helicopter for the first time and from there I immediately understood what aerial photography could reveal. With the drone you discover the world a second time, you discover it from a different and unusual perspective, you enter where no man or mechanical means can do it, you capture unique scenes, never revealed before. And for me, who love the world, who love it infinitely because it is the greatest gift we have received from God, it is that inheritance that we have borrowed from our children but which we will not be able to return in the same conditions in which we has been given, being able to document it in its entirety with over 12 trips a year, most of them travel photo workshop with people, is an absolute privilege. Because this planet made of rock and matter, surrounded by a beauty as sublime as it is ethereal, is showing us its profound signs of weakness, its many fragilities, its ever-widening wounds. And we, the inhabitants of our own planet, are responsible.

Travelled to 145 countries, is author of 13 books and winner of 14 prizes in International photographic competitions. Since 2008 he is a member of Apecs (Association of Polar Early Career Scientists) and since 2015 he cooperates with IASC (International Arctic Science Commitee) for his contributions about environment published in the media. In 2009 he was the only reporter to reach the geographic North Pole on skis. In 2010 Bracali debuted in the world of fine-art photography and his pictures have been on show, as solo exhibitions, in museums and galleries in Rome, Sofia, Kiev, Odessa, Copenaghen, Yangon, Montreal and New York but also in Bruyelles in the headquarter of European Parliament. He signed 210 services as tv director for RAI 1, lately became documentary filmmaker for RAI 2 and RAI 3 and was a guest on 50 programs and TG news aired on Rai networks as an explorer and a story-teller. Eighteen of his last reportages have been published on National Geographic and his pictures has been also featured on New York Post, USA Today Post, Fox News, Lens Culture, PetaPixel, Daily Express, Daily Star, Daily Telegraph and The Sun. From 2017 he became ambassador of the non-profit organization "Save the Planet". The Minor Planet Center in Cambridge dedicated to his name the 198.616th asteroid discovered.

SCANNO: A DRESS, A FAITH, AN IDENTITY







SCANNO IS A TOWN OF ABOUT 1,800 INHABITANTS, AND IT IS LOCATED AT AN ALTITUDE OF 1,050 METERS IN THE CENTER OF ABRUZZO - ITALY. ALREADY INHABITED IN ITALIC AND ROMAN TIMES, IT RETAINS TRADITIONS DATING BACK TO THE 1200S INFLUENCED BY ORIENTAL-OTTOMAN MIGRATIONS, ESPECIALLY IN WOMEN'S CLOTHING.

Every day, the women cover their heads with a simple squareshaped woolen cloth of various colors called maccaturo (from the French mouchoir). On holidays, Ju Cappellitte resembles a turban; in fact, it recalls a Greek "polos" (πόλος) or an Arab turban.

The skirt is ankle-length: it is made up of 6 to 12 very dark green cloths, and each fabric is 60 centimeters wide and sewn vertically until it reaches a length that varies between 11 and 15 meters. Its weight is about 10 Kg.

The skirt is covered by the mantera, over 2 meters wide, which was made of woolen cloth for daily use.

The jacket, called cummudène, was divided from the skirt: black or









blue-black, and it rested above the waist. The buttoning buttenera consists of 12 silver buttons: in the upper part, six buttons are arranged vertically, and another six in the middle are arranged in two orders on a rectangular piece of cloth called pettijja. The buttons have decorations of religious or magicalapotropaic subjects. In the wedding costumes, they are strictly in gold. For the ears, they used more or less large pendants (cerceglie), and for the fingers, rings with very large bezels, real goldsmith masterpieces.

Scanno has been photographed by great artists such as Cartier Bresson, Berengo Gardin, Mario Giacomelli and especially Hilde Lotz-Bauer.

GPU OPENS MEMBERS' EXHIBITION AT PHOTO BEIJING AND ESTABLISH LONG-TERM COOPERATION WITH PHOTO BEIJING

From October 21 to 29, 2023, the exhibitions of Presidents of Photography Societies from Ten Countries and the GPU Members Photo Exhibition was on display at the China Millennium Monument in Beijing, with the GPU as the international organizer. The exhibition was curated by Ms. Guo Jing, GPU Vice President, and was co-organized by the Photo Beijing Organizing Committee, the China Artistic Photography Society, and the Global Photographic Union (GPU).

As an international partner of Photo Beijing and one of the organizers of "View & Appreciate: Exhibitions of Presidents of Photography Societies from Ten Countries," GPU assembles a gallery of 50 photographs by its members from 20 countries, including Greece, Italy, UK, etc.,

Among the fine works of GPU members, there are classic monochrome masterpieces that tell the story of the past as well as life of people, landscape, nature, humanities, creativity, etc. These fascinating photographs cover a variety of subjects, offering a fresh perspective and a rich visual vocabulary that touches the hearts of viewers. It is worth mentioning that all GPU Board members' work also joined this exhibition, which was visited by a large number of visitors.

In addition, GPU also held a presentation, during which Manolis Metzakis, President of GPU, introduce the organization and activities GPU to the audience, and Guo Jing, curator and Vice President of GPU, acted as the moderator and shared the duties and activities of GPU-China.

Meanwhile, Manolis Metzakis also attended as a representative of the international organizers of exhibitions of Presidents of Photography Societies from Ten Countries to share the exhibition and participate together in the discussion on the characteristics and future trends of photography development in the Arab countries.

At the same time, GPU and Photo Beijing signed a memorandum in which the two parties will establish a close partnership in the next five years and work together to promote the art of photography. In addition, GPU President Manolis Metzakis was invited to join the Expert Advisory Committee of Photo Beijing.

At the opening ceremony of Photo Beijing, Manoliz Metzakis delivered a speech to congratulate on the success of the event by Photo Beijing. He also mentioned that over the years, in the spirit of openness and inclusiveness, GPU has been committed to the development of international photographic art and the promotion of cultural exchange among photographers. As photography is playing an increasingly important role in the cross-culture exchange, GPU will take the "Exhibitions of Presidents of Photography Societies from Ten Countries" as a starting point to further carry out comprehensive and in-depth cooperation in cross-boundary fusion and exchanges among countries, and we believe that the Photo Beijing will become a platform for international photographic culture and exchange activities that is inclusive and integrative, and that fuses mutual understanding among the international photographic festivals.

GPU REPRESENTATION AT TAIZHOU PHOTO WEEK 2023

The China-Taizhou International Photo Week 2023 was opened on 7th December 2023, at the Taizhou Contemporary Art Museum. GPU President Manolis Metzakis and GPU Vice President Saeed Al Shamsi are exhibiting at this photography event. Guo Jing, curator, and GPU Vice President, has been invited to be the chief curator of the exhibitions at this event.

In this exhibition, Manolis presented six photographs from a series on the life of the great Greek painter El Greco, taken during production of the movie El Greco. The exhibition was part of the International Exhibition of Masters of Photography and was installed on the first floor of the Museum. For Manolis, he is delighted to have captured the El Greco, and the shooting of the film was a great experience and an unexpected change for him. This photo series is about a movie and represents the innovation and power in Greece, which he wants to convey to the viewers through this work.

Saeed AI Shamsi exhibited his photo series Public Phone Booth which documents the gradual disappearance of the phone booth in every country. It is also a way of preserving the phenomenon that was once indispensable to people's lives and its disappearance from the stage of history. 


